Comments from the President, Rick Hagen

Rick outlines his vision for TCDLA in 2008-09. We will:

- \star Improve the way we treat membership
- ★ Improve relationship with State Bar (i.e. focus on their President-Elect)
- ★ Improve lawyers' public image
- ★ Distribute video presentation and speech (by David Guinn) condensed to 19 minutes to various entities
- ★ Change events to "Membership" retreats, trips and receptions instead of "President's"

Rick has recommended Gerry Morris and David Botsford for appointment to the State Bar's Criminal Pattern Jury Charge Committee.

Rick thanks Suzanne and Gerry for hosting last night's reception and all the course directors over the last few months. He especially recognizes Philip for his seven years service to TCDLA and work in the capital arena.

Executive Director's Report: Joseph Martinez

Joseph introduces Dawn Thornburgh, our new CFO, as well as staff members Christina Abascal, Miriam Rendon, and Susan Fuller, who have been with TCDLA for awhile but have not been introduced to the Board. He also commends Craig Hattersley for completing one year with TCDLA.

We have put on 47 CLE events and trained a total of 5300 lawyers. (Compare this to NACDL's 9 seminars and 2800 trained.) We have put on 313 hours of capital training (Philip, John Niland and CAIL).

We have seen a 9% increase in publications and an 18% increase in merchandise sales.

The "Legends" videotaping is going well.

Capital Report: Philip Wischkaemper

There are 308 death eligible cases but only 6 new ones this year. We are getting many more life sentences. The PD's Office in Lubbock has already gotten 8 life sentences.

On publications, we will be working with GRACE to update the Losch manual. The clerks are also working on the annotated Water Code, the Government Code, other code books, and the Constitution.

Michael Blair's case was finally dismissed.
